Summer 2026 In-person Language and Culture Programs

Program Details:

Dates and Fees: August 3 to 21, 2026 Program Fee \$3350 CAD

August 31 to September 18, 2026 Program Fee \$3350 CAD

The program fee covers:

- Tuition
- Sociocultural activities
- On-campus accommodation
 - o *August program: August 2 check in and August 22 check out*
 - o *September program: August 30 check in and September 19*
- Meals during program dates
 - o *August program: from brunch on August 3 to supper on August 21*
 - o *September program: from breakfast on August 31 to supper on September 18*
- Arrival and Departure service

The program fee does not cover:

- Transit pass for personal use (optional to purchase independently)
- Health insurance (required to purchase independently)
- Fitness pass for the campus gym and swimming pool (optional to purchase independently)
- Costs for doing personal laundry
- Additional food and accommodation costs outside of program dates
 - o Accommodation in university residence (specific 2026 per day cost to be determined)
- Fees for any optional or additional activities
- Flight to and from Regina
- Personal/ miscellaneous expenditures

Total Program Hours: Approx. 110 hours

- Classes: Approx. 63 hours

Program Description:

Through the In-person Language and Culture program, participants will study English communication and experience Western Canadian culture.

Participants will take classes on weekday mornings and afternoons. Classes will focus on real-world English communication appropriate to the level, including:

- Asking for and providing information
- Expressing and supporting an opinion
- Describing an event or experience
- Speaking and/ or writing more fluently
- Improving listening comprehension
- Communicating more confidently in English

Classes will also include topics and themes related to Canadian culture and life in Canada such as:

- Indigenous Peoples of Canada and Saskatchewan
- Multiculturalism
- Canadian landmarks and attractions and attractions specific to Saskatchewan
- Famous Symbols of Canada
- Canadian food and food specific to Saskatchewan
- Popular Canadian sports and activities
- Canadian money
- Common cultural differences to know when visiting Canada

Participants will also do a variety of on-campus and off-campus activities with Cultural Assistants, who are University of Regina students, including:

- Team building games and activities



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- Conversation groups or language games and activities
- Local tours such as the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Heritage Centre, a Saskatchewan farm, the Royal Saskatchewan Museum, Wascana Lake etc.
- Cultural events such as Indigenous ceremonies or multicultural showcases

Before arriving in Regina, participants will receive an online pre-program orientation and will take an online placement test to determine their level.

Each student will receive a certificate of course completion, with name, date and host institution, and a program grade report at the end of the program.
